

EXAMINATION GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

The school is affiliated to CBSE and guidelines suggested by the board have been implemented from Class Pre-nursery onwards. A strong Academic Curriculum is followed with emphasis on experiential learning through planned Class Activities, Audio Visual Aids, Multiple Intelligence Lesson Plans and Modules on the Smart Boards that supplement the teaching content in all Classrooms from Pre-Nursery to XII.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR PRE-PRIMARY

No Formal Examination will be held for these classes. The school will follow a system of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) through a checklist of assignments and observational activities in order to develop a sense of curiosity and desire to explore.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR CLASSES I - III

Periodic Assessments (PA)

- I. There will be two terms; the first term will be from Apr-Sep and the second term from Oct-Mar. Each term will have two Periodic Assessments (PA).
- 2. Each Periodic Assessment for a particular subject will be of 50 marks. The Periodic Test for each subject will be of 40 marks and 10 marks will be given for Classwork/ Homework; and other Activities or Project Work.
- 3. The Periodic Tests will be held on a week day in rotation for all the subjects. Kindly refer to the Academic Planner for the schedule. Any changes in the same will be intimated through a circular.

Note: A retest for PAs will be conducted on a single day after the end of Term I and Term II. A child should have missed only one PA in each term for being eligible for the retest.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR CLASS - IV

- There will be two terms, the first term will be from Apr-Sep and the second term from Oct-Mar. The first term will have two Periodic Assessments (PA) and the second term will have one Periodic Assessment (PA) and one Term End Examination at the end of the year.
- 2. The student's performance is evaluated on the basis of Periodic Assessments (PA) as well as Term End Examination.

Periodic Assessments (PA)

- I. Each Periodic Assessment for a particular subject will be of 50 marks. The Periodic Test for each subject will be of 40 marks and 10 marks will be given for Classwork/ Homework; and other Activities or Project Work.
- 2. Periodic Assessment for Computers will be done in the regular classes.
- 3. The Periodic Tests will be held on a week day in rotation for all the subjects. Kindly refer to the Academic Planner for the schedule. Any changes in the same will be intimated through a circular.

Term End Examination

4. Term End Examinations are written exams at the end of the year which will include objective type questions, short and long answer questions. The maximum marks for Class IV will be 40 for Computers and 80 for main subjects.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR CLASSES V - IX

- There will be two terms; the first term will be from Apr-Sep and the second term from Oct-Mar. First term will have one Periodic Assessment (PA) and one Term End Examination and the second term will have one Periodic Assessment (PA) and one Term End Examination at the end of the year.
- 2. The student's performance is evaluated on the basis of Periodic Assessments (PA) as well as Term End Examination.

Periodic Assessments (PA)

- 3. Each Periodic Assessment for a particular subject will be of 50 marks. The Periodic Test for each subject will be of 40 marks and 10 marks will be given for Classwork/Homework; and other Activities or Project Work.
 - The assessments will have objective as well as subjective questions.
- 4. Periodic Assessment for Computers (for Classes V to VIII) will be done in the regular classes.
- 5. The Periodic Tests will be held on a week day in rotation for all the subjects. Kindly refer to the Academic Planner for the schedule. Any changes in the same will be intimated through a circular.

Term End Examination

6. Term End Examinations are written exams which will include objective type questions, short and long answer questions. The maximum marks will be 80 for main subjects and 40 for Computers (for Classes V to VIII).

A child should have missed only one PA in the entire session for being eligible for the retest.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR CLASS - XI

The school will conduct Periodic Tests, Half Yearly and Annual Exams for students of class XI. The Periodic Tests will be held on a week day in rotation for all the subjects. The student will be promoted to the next class on scoring a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate as well as individual subjects. In subjects involving practical work, a student must obtain 40% marks in theory and practical examination separately.

ASSESSMENT POLICY FOR CLASSES - X AND XII

The school will conduct weekly Periodic Tests, Practice Exams and Pre-board Exams for students of class X and XII. The students have to appear in the exam conducted by the Board.





SCHOOL AWARDS

- I. 'Scholar Badge' will be awarded to students of Classes I III for getting AI in all the subjects in both the terms.
- 2. 'Scholar Badge' will be awarded to students of Classes IV to IX and XI for scoring 90% and above.
- 3. 'Reading Award' will be given to students of Classes I XII for reading twenty age-appropriate books during the year.
- (a) 'Two Year's Chairman's Medal' (Primary) will be awarded to students for getting a scholar badge for two consecutive years in Classes IV and V.
 (b) 'Three Year's Chairman's Medal' (Middle) will be awarded to students for getting a scholar badge for three consecutive years in Classes VI, VII and VIII.
 (c) 'Two Year's Chairman's Medal' (Senior) will be awarded to students for getting a scholar badge for two consecutive years in Classes IX and X.
- 5. 'Academic Excellence Award' will be given to students of Class X for scoring 95% and above in the board examination.
- 6. 'Maurya Pride' will be given for Best Achievement in Sports/Co-scholastics.
- 7. 'Maurya Ace' will be given for Outstanding Achievement in Sports/Coscholastics at the National/International Level.
- 8. 'Chairman's Trophy' will be given to the All Round Best Student of Class XII.
- 9. 'Senior School Topper Award' will be given to the student scoring the highest percentage in the Class XII board examination.
- 10. Scholarship will be awarded in Class XI to the top three students scoring at least 95% and above in Class X.
- 11. 100% scholarship will be awarded in Class XII to the students scoring 95% and above in Class XI. 75% scholarship will be awarded to the students scoring above 90% in Class XI. 50% scholarship will be awarded to the students scoring above 85% in Class XI.
